This application form must not be altered in any way. It can be either completed electronically using Adobe Reader (which can be downloaded free of charge from www.adobe.com.au) or printed.

Note: If an application is lodged and any information that is required to accompany that application is lodged with the Secretary more than 10 business days after lodging the application, the application is taken to have been refused (*Mining Regulation 2010 Clause 76(9)*).

The holder of any mineral claim granted as a result of this application must ensure that no rights conferred by the mineral claim are exercised until such provisions have been complied with.
